



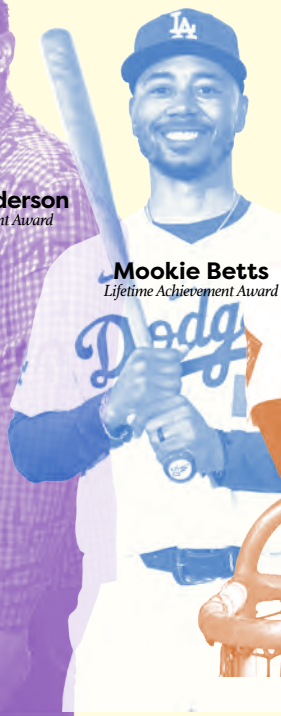

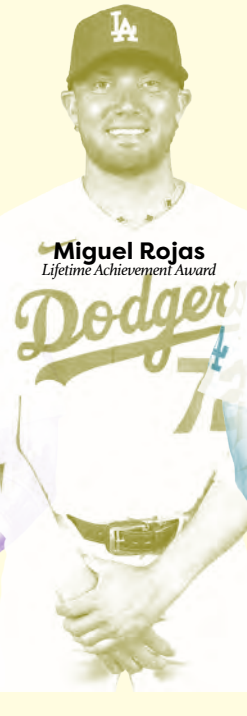

Dedicated to raising funds for organizations in need, strengthening communities, and improving the lives of those we serve.

The **Harold and Carole Pump Foundation (HCPF)** was established in honor of a beloved father who courageously battled cancer until his passing in 2000, and a loving mother who passed away in 2012. Inspired by their parents' strength, compassion, and legacy, brothers Dana and David Pump have dedicated themselves to making a meaningful difference in the fight against cancer.

Through their extraordinary relationship-building abilities and strong partnerships within the community, Dana and David Pump, in collaboration with the Northridge Hospital Foundation, have helped raise more than \$13.5 million to support the Carole Pump Women's Center, the Harold & Carole Pump Department of Radiation Oncology, the Pump Family Infusion Center, and the Thomas and Dorothy Leavey Cancer Center at Northridge Hospital Medical Center, and numerous other nonprofit community organizations.

The mission of the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation is to raise funds and create awareness for the treatment, prevention, and cure of cancer. By bringing together community leaders, sports figures, healthcare professionals, donors, and families

impacted by the disease, the Foundation provides critical financial support for innovative cancer treatments, patient-centered programs, supportive services, and advanced medical technologies that improve the lives of those facing cancer

EDUCATION AND FREE SCREENINGS

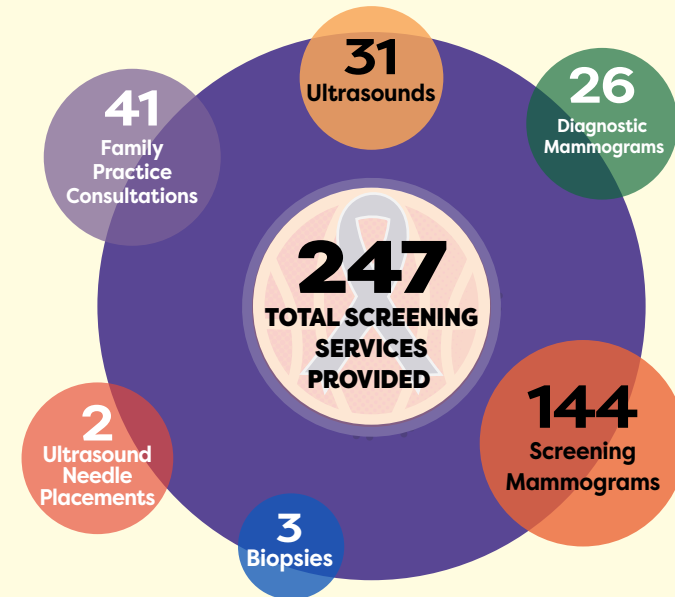
Educating the community about cancer prevention and the importance of early detection is essential to improving the health and well-being of our residents. Through free educational outreach and life-saving cancer screenings, early diagnosis can significantly improve outcomes and save lives.

In 2025, the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation Outreach Program participated in 37 community events, providing cancer awareness education to 4,730 individuals throughout the community.

The Carole Pump Women's Center at Northridge Hospital hosted 12 FREE "Reaching Out" Health Fairs for uninsured members of our community. These Health Fairs welcomed hundreds of attendees who received free breast evaluations and screening services in a compassionate and supportive environment. In addition to screenings, participants were educated on prevention strategies and healthy lifestyle choices that

may help reduce their risk of developing cancer.

In 2025, the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation provided 247 FREE screening and support services, including:



PATIENT NAVIGATOR

A cancer diagnosis can be overwhelming not only for patients, but also for their families and loved ones. The Family Plan Program was created to provide compassionate guidance, emotional support, and personalized assistance throughout every step of the cancer journey.

Through the generous support of the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation, a dedicated Patient Navigator serves as a trusted resource and advocate for patients and their families. Working one-on-one with both inpatients and outpatients, the Navigator helps individuals better understand and access the services available through the Carole Pump Women's Center, the Harold & Carole Pump Department of Radiation Oncology, and the Leavey Cancer Center.

The Patient Navigator provides compassionate support, education, encouragement, and care coordination to help ease the stress and uncertainty that often accompanies a cancer diagnosis. By connecting patients and families with critical resources, treatment information, support services, and symptom management tools, the Family Plan Program empowers individuals to make informed decisions and feel supported every step of the way.

FAMILY PLAN - SUPPORT, COMFORT, HOME HEALTH

The Family Plan Program was created to provide comfort, support, and practical assistance to cancer patients and their families during some of life's most challenging moments. The program helps ease the financial and emotional burdens associated with a cancer diagnosis by assisting with home healthcare services, supportive care, and essential equipment needs.

Patients facing cancer often endure difficult treatments, invasive procedures, exhausting side effects, and ongoing uncertainty. These physical challenges are frequently accompanied by emotional stress, fatigue, anxiety, and depression that impact not only the patient, but also their loved ones and caregivers.

The Family Plan Program is designed to provide compassionate one-on-one support and resources that help patients maintain dignity, comfort, and quality of life throughout treatment and recovery. Whether receiving care in the hospital or at home, patients and families can rely on the Foundation's commitment to ensuring they feel supported every step of the way.

In 2025, the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation provided cancer patients with more than 389 hours of home healthcare and personalized one-on-one support services.

FAMILY PLAN PROGRAM - TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE FOR PATIENTS IN NEED

Reliable transportation is essential for cancer patients to access life-saving treatments, follow-up appointments, and critical diagnostic testing. For many patients and families facing financial hardship, transportation can become a significant barrier to receiving consistent care.

Through the Family Plan Program, the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation dedicates funding to provide transportation assistance for cancer patients who have no reliable means of travel to and from the hospital for treatments, consultations, and medical tests. This compassionate service helps reduce stress for patients and families while ensuring individuals can continue

receiving the care they need without interruption. In 2025, the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation provided 1,238 transportation trips for patients in need. This program continues to be an invaluable resource, offering comfort, accessibility, and peace of mind to those facing the challenges of cancer treatment.

FAMILY PLAN PROGRAM - MASSAGE THERAPY PROGRAM

A cancer diagnosis and treatment journey can place tremendous physical and emotional strain on patients and their families. The Family Plan Program helps support the overall well-being of patients by providing services designed to reduce stress, promote comfort, and improve quality of life during treatment and recovery.

Through the Leavey Cancer Center Massage Therapy Program, patients are offered compassionate therapeutic care three days each week in a calming and supportive environment. Patients may choose from 20-minute neck and shoulder, hand, or foot massage sessions specifically designed to help ease the physical and emotional challenges associated with cancer treatment.

These therapeutic sessions help reduce stress, anxiety, pain, fatigue, and nausea while also providing comfort, relaxation, and meaningful human connection during a difficult time. By supporting both emotional wellness and physical relief, the program offers patients moments of peace and healing throughout their cancer journey.

In 2025, a total of 688 massage therapy sessions were provided to cancer patients through this program.

Anthony Anderson

Lifetime Achievement Award



Emmy and Golden Globe nominated actor Anthony Anderson starred for 8 seasons in ABC's multi-award nominated sitcom "black-ish" as Andre "Dre" Johnson, where he also served as executive producer.

Most recently, Anderson starred in Amazon MGM's action thriller G2o, opposite Viola Davis. The film centered around terrorists attempting to take over the G2o summit with President Sutton (Davis), bringing her governing and military experience to defend her family, company, and the world. Anderson plays the First Gentleman who endeavors to protect their two children and reunited with Marsai Martin who played their daughter. He also hosted the Netflix reboot of the iconic talent competition show "Star Search" with first ever live real-time viewer voting.

Anderson has also partnered with Cedric the Entertainer to launch their own barbecue label, AC Barbeque, and documented their journey to become barbecue masters on the A&E Network unscripted series "Kings of BBQ." The brand opened its first restaurant in Westfield Century City in 2025 and will release their cookbook AC BBQ The Husky and Handsome Guide to Grilling in May 2026 published by Simon & Schuster.

Anderson is well versed as a host having hosted the 75th Annual Emmy Awards live on FOX, where he brought his signature humor and charm, receiving positive reviews for his performance. He also hosted and executive produced FOX's "The Real Full Monty," a two-hour special raising awareness for prostate and testicular cancer testing and research. His other hosting credits include the ABC game show, "To Tell the Truth," a popular primetime re-imagining of the beloved classic game show of the same name, which ran for seven seasons and the FOX game show "We Are Family." In 2023 he embarked on a six-week journey around Europe with his mother for their E! reality series "Trippin' with Anthony Anderson and Mama Doris." Anderson also reprised his role as Detective Kevin Barnard on the 21st season of the highly anticipated return of "Law and Order." Anderson was also executive producer of the 'black-ish' spin off, "grown-ish" for Freeform and "Road Trippin'" with Rickey Thompson and Denzel Dion which aired on SnapChat.

Anderson has become familiar to audiences through roles in such prominent films as the Michael Bay blockbuster TRANSFORMERS, Martin Scorsese's Oscar-winning feature THE DEPARTED alongside a stellar cast including Leonardo DiCaprio, Matt Damon and Jack Nicholson, and the all-star comedy THE BIG YEAR. Anderson first gained attention as one of Jim Carrey's sons in ME, MYSELF, AND IRENE and has since appeared in such films as the BARBERSHOP franchise, SCARY MOVIE 3, KANGAROO JACK, EXIT WOUNDS, CRADLE 2 THE GRAVE, TWO CAN PLAY THAT GAME, MALIBU'S MOST WANTED, MY BABY'S DADDY, AGENT CODY BANKS 2, HAROLD AND KUMAR GO TO WHITE CASTLE, SMALL TOWN CRIME, THE STAR AND the Academy Award nominated FERDINAND. Most recently, Anderson starred in and was the executive producer of Netflix's film BEATS, alongside Uzo Aduba and newcomer Khalil Everage.

On the small screen, Anderson brought his talent and humor to his own WB sitcom "All About the Andersons" which was loosely based on his life. Anderson also starred in Fox's "K-Ville" opposite Cole Hauser and had a recurring role in the police-drama television series, "The Shield," opposite Michael Chiklis and Glenn Close and in NBC's "Guys with Kids". He went on to star as Kevin Bernard in "Law & Order." Anderson has hosted several culinary focused shows on the Food Network including "Eating America, with Anthony Anderson" and "Carnival Cravings with Anthony Anderson," as well as served as a regular judge on "Iron Chef America." For the past two years, Anderson has hosted "Dear Mama: An Event to Honor Moms," which is VH1's annual Mother's Day celebration to salute moms everywhere.

In addition, he's been a frequent guest host of "Jimmy Kimmel Live."

Anderson has received seven consecutive Emmy nominations for "Outstanding Lead Actor in a Comedy Series", three Golden Globe nominations and three Critics Choice nominations for his popular role in "black-ish." He has also been nominated for 4 Emmy's as a producer on "black-ish" for "Outstanding Comedy Series." Additionally, in 2022, he won his eighth individual Image Award in the category of "Outstanding Actor in a Comedy Series," adding to his 18 total Image Award nominations in his career. He has been nominated for four Screen Actors Guild awards, BET Awards, and Teen Choice awards as well as one People's Choice Awards and one Kids' Choice Awards. Anderson hosted the NAACP Image Awards for nine years from 2014-2022, the CLIO Awards in 2022 and co-hosted the BET Awards in 2015 and 2016 with Tracee Ellis Ross. In 2020, he was awarded a Star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame and in 2022, Anderson was named as one of the 2022 Disney Legend Award recipients, The Walt Disney Company's highest honor recognizing individuals who have made an extraordinary and integral contribution to The Walt Disney Company.

An advocate and philanthropist, Anderson holds an annual Anthony Anderson Celebrity Golf Classic, benefiting the American Diabetes Association, Los Angeles Mission and Boys & Girls Club of America. He also proudly serves on the GOOD+ Foundation's Fatherhood Leadership Council and was inducted into the Class of 2017 Boys & Girls Club of America National Alumni Hall of Fame. Anderson has Type 2 diabetes and is an advocate for diabetes awareness and a spokesperson for the "Get Real About Diabetes" campaign. He received the 2023 Golden Glove Award by the Sugar Ray Leonard Foundation acknowledging Anderson's commitment to helping raise awareness for diabetes. Anderson has hosted the National Memorial Day Parade for the last four years and in 2020 due to Covid-19, he co-hosted "The 2020 National Memorial Day Parade: America Stands Tall" television special. He was also co-host of the 2021 Stand Up To Cancer (SU2C) telecast which aired simultaneously on more than 60 participating media platforms.

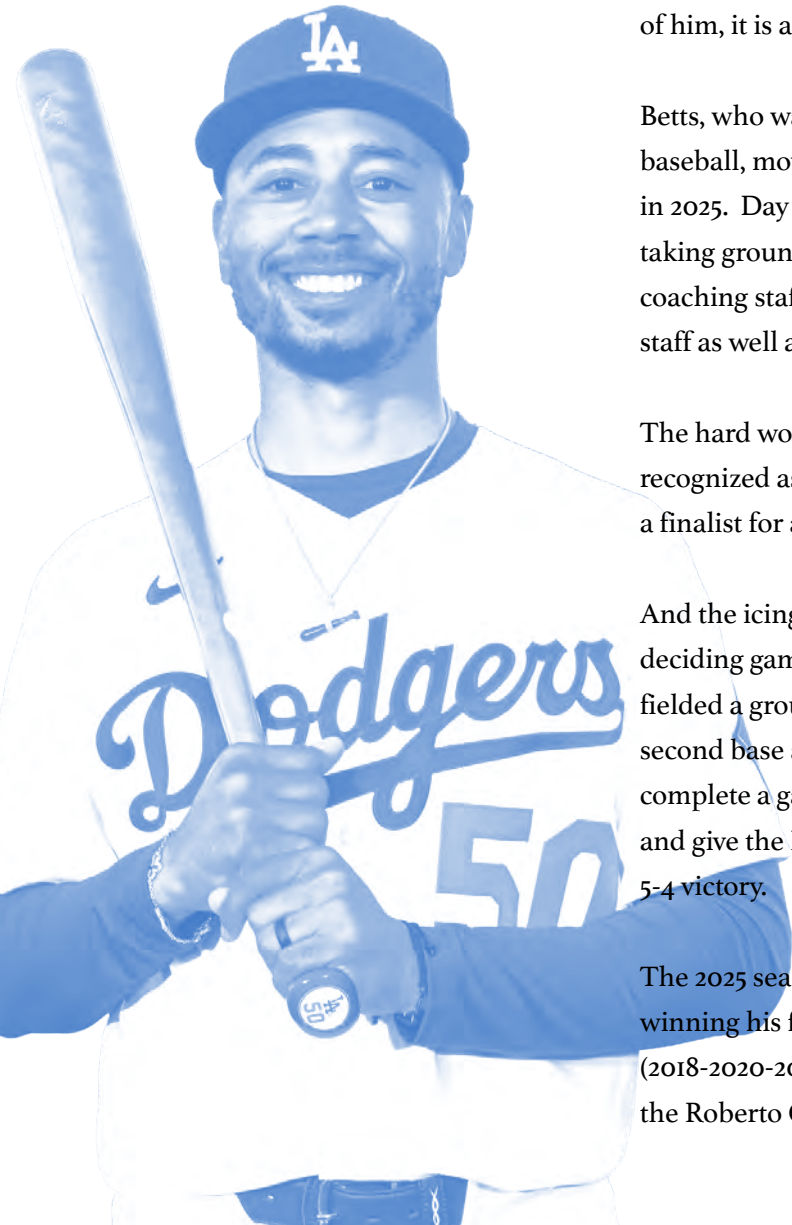
Anderson has always been a supporter of his hometown, Compton, California. He received the 2023 Trailblazer Award from the Woodcraft Rangers to honor his achievements and support the next generation of youth in Los Angeles by the organization with core values of inclusion, access and expanded learning opportunities. He has partnered with the City of Compton in holiday food giveaways in the city where they provided food to over 1,000 residents. In 2020, Anderson emceed The Los Angeles Dodgers Foundation (LADF), in partnership with Kershaw's Challenge and the City of Compton, groundbreaking ceremony at Gonzales Park to kick off construction of their Dodger's Dreamfields project to support local youths.

In the battle against Covid-19, Anderson joined Mayor Garcetti at a South L.A. clinic to urge communities of color to seek COVID-19 testing. He also co-hosted the "Saving Our Selves: A BET COVID-19 Relief Effort" special, to support African Americans impacted by coronavirus.

Born in 1970, Anderson pursued his acting career as he continued his education by attending Hollywood High School for the Performing Arts, where he earned first place in the NAACP's ACTSO Awards with his performance of the classic monologue from "The Great White Hope." That performance, along with his dedication to his craft, earned him an arts scholarship to Howard University. Anderson currently lives in Los Angeles.

Mookie Betts

Lifetime Achievement Award



Mookie Betts can just about do anything he wants to do.

Once he puts his mind and dedication into what's in front of him, it is all systems go.

Betts, who was one of the greatest right fielders in baseball, moved over to shortstop to fill a Dodgers need in 2025. Day after day, Betts spent extra time in the field taking ground ball after ground ball from the Dodgers coaching staff and getting advice on the position from the staff as well as veteran Miguel Rojas.

The hard work and dedication paid off as Betts was recognized as one of the elite shortstops in the game and a finalist for a National League Gold Glove.

And the icing on the cake came in the World Series in the deciding game seven in Toronto as the talented Betts fielded a ground ball by Alejandro Kirk, stepped on second base and threw to Freddie Freeman at first base to complete a game ending double play in the 11th inning and give the Dodgers back-to-back championships with a 5-4 victory.

The 2025 season was extra special for Betts, not only winning his fourth World Series championship and ring (2018-2020-2024-2025), but his peers recognized him with the Roberto Clemente Award given to the Major League

player, whose impact on lives through his charitable work. Betts is always giving of himself, whether it is on the field or off the field.

A 13-year Major Leaguer, the Dodgers were very fortunate indeed to obtain Betts' services in a trade with the Boston Red Sox in 2020. And over the seven years in Dodger Blue, Betts has helped the organization win three World Championships.

The start of his 2025 season didn't go the way he wanted as he came down with a stomach virus as the Dodgers opened the season in Japan with the Chicago Cubs. The talented athlete dropped more than 20 pounds and found himself on the injured list. He returned in early April and still played in 150 games, while getting stronger, and hit .258 with 20 home runs and 82 RBI.

Betts has been putting up numbers and accolades that point to the Hall of Fame as he has a lifetime batting average of .290 with 291 home runs and 913 RBIs entering this season. He's a seven-time silver slugger, an eight-time All-Star, a six-time Gold Glove winner and a five-time member of the All-MLB team.

A multiple 300 game bowler, he recently took up guitar.

Who knows what he will do next?

Dave Roberts

Lifetime Achievement Award



Dave Roberts has done a masterful job in his 10-year managerial career with the Los Angeles Dodgers.

A Hall of Fame communicator, Roberts has guided the Dodgers to perfection over his first 10 years in which he has the highest winning percentage of .621 in National and American League history. Entering the 2026 season, Roberts has a record of 944-576 as a major league manager and a goal to become the third organization to win back-to-back-to-back championships in history. Only the New York Yankees and Oakland A's have been able to turn the trick...so the Dodgers would be the first in National League history if they do so in 2026.

Roberts is the only National League manager in history to lead his team to the playoffs in his first 10 seasons and the first to accomplish the feat since Joe Torre led the Yankees to the playoffs in his first 12 seasons at the helm.

While doing so, Roberts guided the Dodgers to back-to-back World Championships in 2024 and 2025 and also took home the big prize in 2020. It was the 2025 championship that earned Roberts the most praise as his moves and motivation guided the Dodger Blue to victories in game six and game seven in Toronto to give the organization its ninth World Championship in its rich history.

Roberts is one of 11 managers with three World Series titles and nine of those managers are in the Hall of Fame.

Hall of Fame Dodger manager Walter Alston won three World Series titles and made four trips to the World Series in his first 10 seasons as Dodger manager. And another Dodger Hall of Famer, Tommy Lasorda won two World Series.

His managerial career with the Dodgers started when he became the 28th manager in Dodgers franchise history on Nov. 23, 2015. He also became the first manager of color in Dodger history.

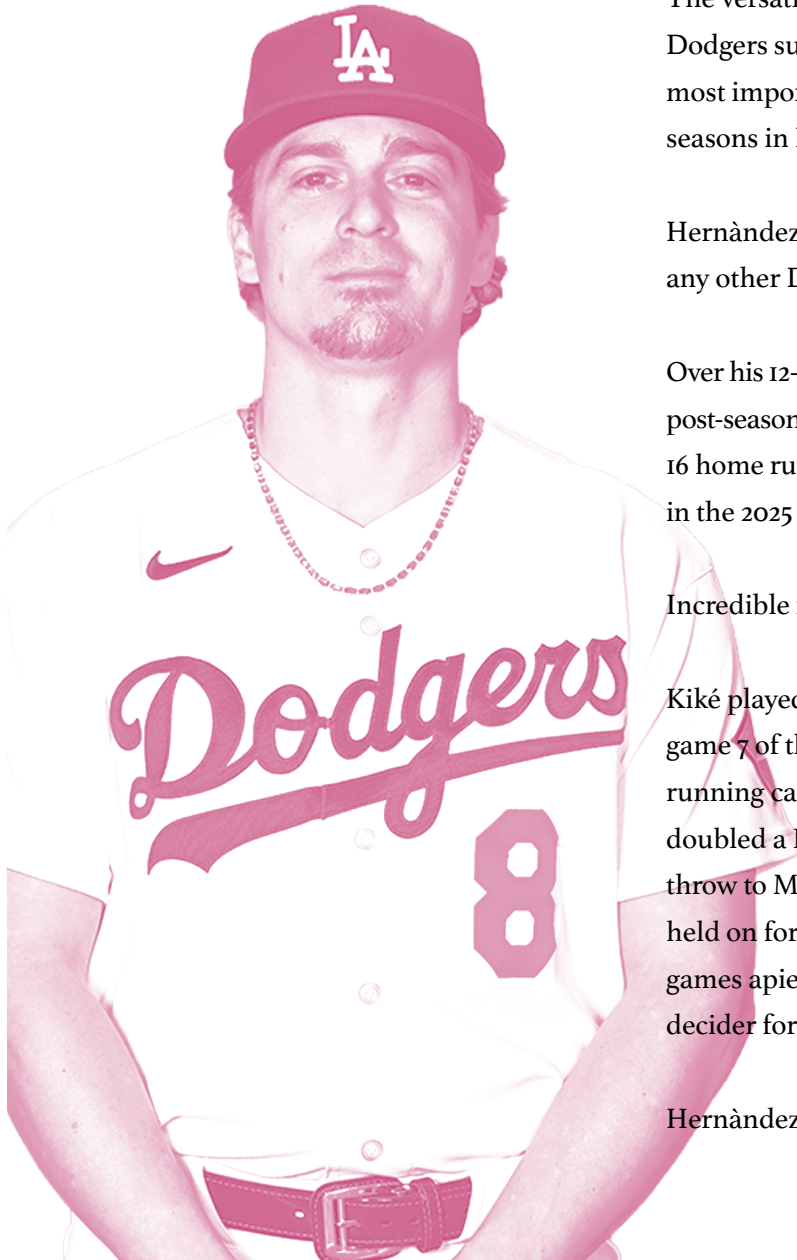
Before turning his sights to managing in the big leagues, Roberts played 10 years in the majors. He debuted with Cleveland on Aug. 7, 1999 and played for five different clubs--the Indians (1999-2001), Dodgers (2002-04, Boston (2004), San Diego (2005-06) and San Francisco (2007-08).

Roberts was most famous in his playing career for stealing second base off the Yankees' Mariano Rivera in the ninth inning of Game 4 of the 2004 American League Championship Series. The steal put him in position to score the tying run as Boston became the first team in MLB history to rally from a 3-0 series deficit in the postseason and win a seven-game series.

Following his 10-year playing career, he spent the 2010 season in San Diego's front office, became the Padres' first base coach from 2011-13, then became their bench coach in 2014 and 2015 and then got the call from the Dodgers to guide them as their manager.

Kiké Hernández

Lifetime Achievement Award



Kiké Hernández loves October baseball.

The versatile Dodger has played a major role in the Dodgers success not only during the regular season, but most importantly in the post-season over the past nine seasons in Dodger Blue.

Hernández has played in more post-season games than any other Dodger in team history.

Over his 12-year Major League career, he has played in 103 post-season games and has a career .272 batting average with 16 home runs and 42 RBIs. He played in all seven games in the 2025 World Series against the Toronto Blue Jays.

Incredible numbers for an incredible player.

Kiké played an important role in getting the Dodgers to game 7 of the World Series in 2025, when he made a great running catch in left field in the ninth inning and doubled a Blue Jay off second base with a bang bang throw to Miguel Rojas to end the game. The Dodgers held on for a 3-1 victory and evened the series at three games apiece and send the Dodgers to a game seven decider for the World Championship.

Hernández was also involved in tracking what could have

been a game ending ninth inning play in game seven, when Toronto Blue Jays Ernie Clement hit a ball to left center. Hernandez and centerfielder Andy Pages came together on the warning track and it was Pages who made the unbelievable catch. The catch sent the game into extra innings and gave the Dodgers new life and eventually thanks to an 11th inning Will Smith home run, a world championship for the ages.

Hernández has been one of the most popular Dodgers. The fan favorite has also been one of manager Dave Roberts favorites as well. Roberts knows that he can utilize Kiké at any position on the field except catcher and he has done just that. He has played every position, but catcher. Yes, he has even come in to pitch in a lop-sided contest and has a bobblehead to prove it.

The Puerto Rican star started his pro baseball career in 2009 after being drafted by the Houston Astros. He made it to the big leagues in 2014 and was traded to the Marlins in mid-season. At the end of the season, he was traded to the Dodgers and played six years in Los Angeles before signing with the Boston Red Sox as a free agent in 2021. In the middle of the 2023 season, the Red Sox traded him back to the Dodgers and he's been a major part in the Dodgers back-to-back World Championships in 2024 and 2025.

Andy Pages

Lifetime Achievement Award

There were many defining plays in the Los Angeles Dodgers game seven World Series victory.

The Dodgers would have never got to the 11th inning to see Will Smith's deciding home run in Toronto if not for young centerfielder Andy Pages.

Pages, who was an international signee by the Dodgers in 2018, was inserted into the game and in centerfield by manager Dave Roberts one batter before he made a spectacular series saving play on the warning track just shy of the wall.

With the bases loaded and two out in the bottom of the ninth inning and the score tied in World Series Game 7 at 4 apiece, Pages sprinted 121 feet in 5.5 seconds (22 feet per cent) and made the catch of the series off a 366-foot drive by Ernie Clement, while crashing into left fielder Kiké Hernández.

Pages progressed through the Dodgers minor league system, taking five years (plus a sixth year, where he didn't play because of COVID). In 2024, after a fast start at Oklahoma City in just 16 games at Triple-A, Pages earned the call to the big club.

One year later, Pages had his best season as he hit .272 with 27 doubles, 27 home runs and 86 RBIs. Pages found difficulty at the plate in the post-season, but he continued to work hard in hopes of getting the call off the bench. The biggest call came in the ninth inning of Game 7, when Roberts called Pages number for defensive purposes and he was more than ready.

In just two years, Pages has developed into one of the finest center fielders in the league. He has shown opposing teams that he has a strong arm to reckon with as he is among the league leaders in outfield assists.

And in the first half of the 2026, Pages hard off-season work has paid off at the plate as he is among the top hitters in the league and his RBI numbers are at the top of the league leaders.

Pages is one of the bright future stars of the Dodgers as the 25-year-old out of La Habana, Cuba was 18-years-old when he left home to sign with the Dodgers in 2018.

It wasn't the easiest of times for Pages as he left Cuba and his family and did not see them again until 2023. During those years, Pages continued to work hard with the Dodgers coaching staff and eventually landed a permanent spot in Los Angeles in the Dodgers outfield.

And a permanent spot in his teammates memories for a game seven World Series saving catch that eventually led to the Dodgers winning back-to-back championships.

Miguel Rojas

Lifetime Achievement Award

With the Dodgers down 4-3 in the 9th inning of game 7 of the 2025 World Series in Toronto, the team had two outs left to them against Blue Jays closer Jeff Hoffman. Up stepped Miguel Rojas to the plate. Rojas, who did not have a hit in the month of October, connected a 387-foot home run to left field to get the Dodgers even and eventually send the game to extra innings and hope for back-to-back World Championships. The Dodgers would eventually win the title in the 11th inning in a 5-4 victory.

Rojas, who hails from Venezuela and is playing in his 13th season in the Major Leagues, had hit only one home run in the second half of the 2025 season. With the home run on a 3-2 hanging slider, Rojas became the first player in MLB history to hit a game-tying home run in the 9th inning or later of a World Series Game 7.

The trusty Rojas began his Major League career with the Dodgers in 2012 and made it to Los Angeles in 2014. He was traded at the end of the year to Miami and returned to the Dodgers in 2023 and is playing his fourth year with the Dodgers.

One thing Rojas does bring is his experience and knowledge, something that he has passed on to Mookie Betts, who he worked with when Betts transitioned from his normal right field spot to play shortstop for the Dodgers each and every day.

Rojas had his best year as a Dodger in 2025, when he hit .262 in 114 games with seven home runs and 27 RBI. It was a year in which "Miggy" as he is called will be remembered as a savior at the plate and in the field in giving the Dodgers the opportunity to make it back-to-back World Champions.

Will Smith

Lifetime Achievement Award



There were so many possible scenarios to the 2025 World Series, but it only took one crack of the bat to make the Dodgers World Champions.

With the score tied in the top of the 11th inning, it was the veteran catcher Will Smith who slugged a 366-foot shot to left field that thrust the Dodgers in front in game 7 of the World Series at Toronto. It was the first extra-inning homer in a winner-take-all-game in World Series history.

The 8-year veteran and 3-time World Series champion was a workhorse for the Dodgers as he caught all 73 innings of the World Series, more than any player in Fall Classic history.

The Dodgers got their man behind the plate back in 2016, when he was the 32nd player chosen in the first round of the draft out of the University of Louisville. It didn't take him long to reach the big leagues as he made Dodger Stadium his home in 2019.

Smith has earned All-Star honors the past 3 seasons. Last year at the break, he was hitting .323 with 12 home runs and 46 RBI to earn the All-Star honor. Smith finished last season with his best year at the plate when he hit .296 with 20 doubles, 17 home runs and 61 RBIs. Over his 7

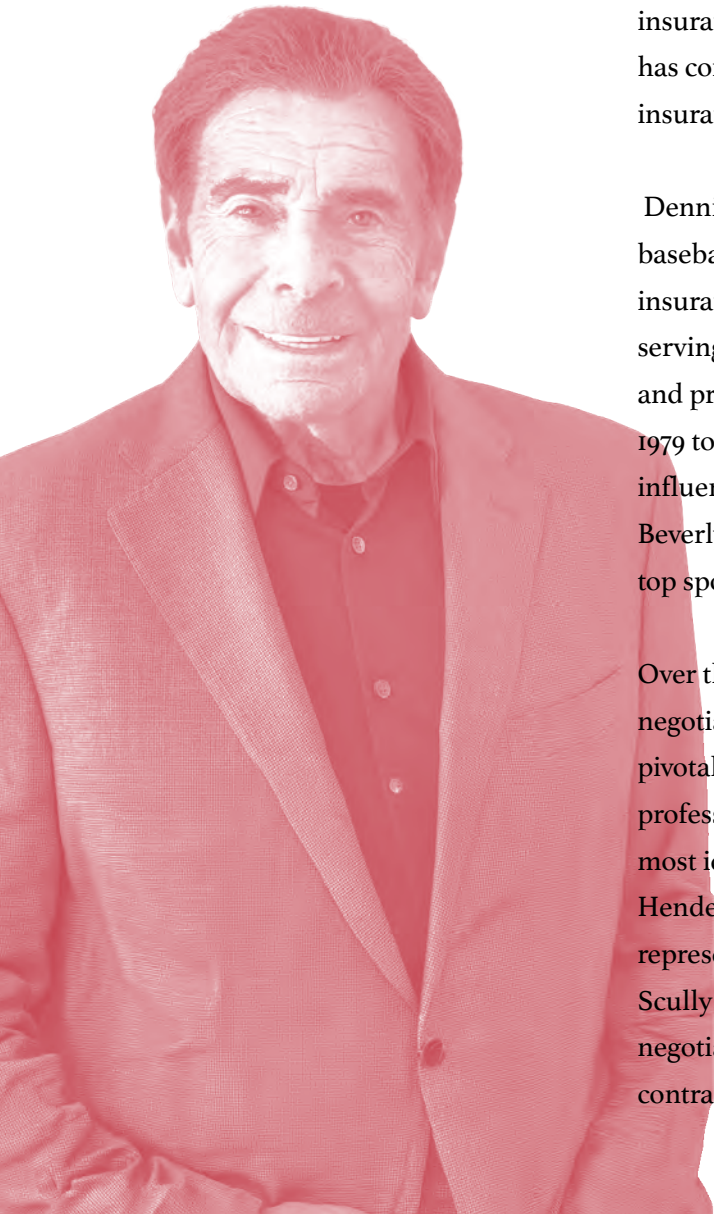
years in the big leagues, he has averaged almost 20 home runs a season. He hit a career high of 25 homers in 2021.

In 2024, Smith became the 4th Dodger catcher to hit 3 home runs in a game on July 5th against Milwaukee, joining Roy Campanella, Mike Piazza and Yasmani Grandal.

Besides his accomplishments at the plate, the 30-year-old receiver continues to show his leadership in guiding the Dodger pitching staff to be the best in baseball.

Dennis Gilbert

He represented some of the game's most iconic players, including Barry Bonds, Rickey Henderson, Mike Piazza, and George Brett. He also represented two iconic figures in broadcasting—Vin Scully and Larry King. He is perhaps best known for negotiating the landmark deferred compensation contract for Bobby Bonilla, widely regarded as one of the

most creative deals in sports history. He has also, since 2002, served as Special Assistant to the Chairman of the Chicago White Sox, advising on player contracts and personnel matters.

Throughout his career, Dennis has earned numerous honors, including “Man of the Year” from the Anti-Defamation League, a Lifetime Achievement Award from Baseball Assistance Team, and induction into the Los Angeles City College Hall of Fame. He has also received “Man of the Year” honors from Equitable, Nationwide, Provident Mutual, and Mutual of New York.

Dennis's commitment to giving back includes serving as Founder and Chairman of the Professional Baseball Scouts Foundation, which has raised millions for financially vulnerable scouts and their families. He also financed the development of the baseball field at Southwest Community College, and has served on MLB committees for salary arbitration and player diversity. Most recently, he was named Commissioner of Perfect Game and founded the Believe in Baseball Foundation to support underprivileged players.

Dennis resides in Holmby Hills, California, with his wife, Cindi. He enjoys spending time with their three daughters and grandchildren.

Nicholas Rowley

Humanitarian Award



Nicholas C. Rowley is a renowned national trial lawyer, published author, philanthropist, and founder of Trial Lawyers for Justice, with a distinguished career marked by over \$3.5 billion in verdicts and settlements on behalf of injury victims and their families across the United States.

Born in Storm Lake, Iowa, Nick's early life was characterized by significant challenges, including periods of poverty and bullying during his childhood in Nogales, Arizona, and small town Iowa. Demonstrating resilience, he became self-supporting by the fifth grade and was emancipated at 16. At 17, he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force and served a total of 6 years as a medic in the USAF and US Army. Military education benefits helped Nick earn a bachelor's degree in Social Psychology by age 19 and commencing law school at 20.

Nick's legal career is distinguished by numerous record-setting verdicts across the country, including the largest medical malpractice verdict in history in the amount of \$412 million, a \$131 million verdict for a car crash victim, a \$74.5 million verdict in a medical malpractice birth injury case, a \$50 million against Starbucks on behalf of a 25 year old who was seriously burned and disfigured as a result of a reckless corporate culture. In Washington State, Nick has been instrumental in securing significant multiple jury verdicts against Monsanto for injuries and damages suffered by children, parents and teachers who were exposed to polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) in a public school. The list of seven, eight and nine figure jury verdicts goes on and on.

Beyond the courtroom, Nick is a dedicated philanthropist and advocate. He co-founded Trial By Human, a

non-profit program aimed at enhancing trial skills for plaintiff lawyers. His humanitarian and philanthropic efforts extend internationally, including funding and constructing educational centers and helping underserved communities and non-profits in the United States, Costa Rica, Kenya, and Bhutan.

Nick has invested years of his life and tens of millions of dollars towards protecting, preserving, and improving the Civil Justice Systems in America and leading the charge to change unjust laws such as California's 1975 \$250,000 Non-Economic Damages Cap (MICRA). Nick has done and continues to do similar work in multiple other States. He is the founder of Justice Watch, a national organization dedicated to protecting and policing the judiciary throughout the United States and as an answer to the far right's organization (Judicial Watch), which is dedicated to tort reform and appointing Judges who are willing to trample on our 7th Amendment rights and uphold insurance company sponsored legislation that places caps on damages.

Nick's commitment to justice and empathy for his clients have earned him recognition from numerous trial lawyer organizations and consumer advocate groups. He embodies a relentless pursuit of justice, while offering world-class training to attorneys that seek self-improvement, both in and out of the courtroom. Nick shares his teachings through his books (*Running With the Bulls*, *Trial By Human*, *Damages Evolving*), as well as his podcast "Brutal Honesty" which debuted at #47 on the Apple Podcasts Self Improvement category in the US.
